### MAURITIUS MENTAL HEALTH ASSOCIATION ACT

### 1. Short title

This Act may be cited as the Mauritius Mental Health Association Act.

## 2. Interpretation

In this Act, "Association" means the Mauritius Mental Health Association established by section 3.

## 3. Establishment of Association

There is established for the purposes of this Act the Mauritius Mental Health Association which shall be a body corporate.

## 4. Objects of Association

The objects of the Association shall be to-

- (a) promote good human relations and the highest level of mental health, either alone or in co-operation with other national or international organisations;
- (b) foster the ability to live harmoniously in a changing environment and encourage research in the field of mental health;
- (c) promote co-operation among scientific and professional groups which contribute to the advancement of mental health and encourage the improvement of standards of training in the relevant profession;
- (d) provide information, advice and assistance in the field of mental health; and
- (e) promote and manage a school for educationally subnormal children.

### 5. The Committee

The Association shall be managed by a Committee constituted in accordance with rules made under this Act.

## 6. Legal proceedings

- (1) Service of process by or on the Association shall be sufficient if made on behalf of or on the Secretary.
- (2) The name and address of the Secretary of the Association shall be published in the *Gazette*.

# 7. Donations and legacies

Article 910 of the Code Civil Mauricien shall not apply to the Association.

## 8. Exemptions

Notwithstanding any other enactment—

- (a) the Association shall be exempt from the payment of any duty, rate, charge, fee or tax;
- (b) no stamp duty or registration fee shall be payable by the Association in respect of any document under which the Association is a beneficiary.

### 9. Rules

The Association may make such rules as it thinks fit for the purposes of this Act.
