At present the Intermediate Court (Criminal and Civil Divisions) are housed in the New Court House building and occupies the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> floors respectively. It also houses the three divisions of the District Court of Port Louis and the Bail and Remand Court on the ground and first floors, the Industrial Court on the 4<sup>th</sup> floor and the Family Division of the Supreme Court on the 5<sup>th</sup> Floor. It is expected that when the new Supreme Court building will be ready for occupation the Family division will move there thus more Court rooms will be available at the New Court House. Due to infrastructural problems at the New Court House for the time being and due to limited accommodation facilities, all the funded posts could not be filled.
